Provide Opportunities and Resources – Encourage children to look around for things that interest them. Reinforce to them that these opportunities can pop up at any time and in any place. Be Positive – Make learning enjoyable. Be enthusiastic about learning and the children will pick up on that attitude.

Be Supportive – While you want to encourage students to learn on their own, if you see them struggling, don't hesitate to step in and provide guidance if needed. This doesn't mean doing the work for them, but rather showing them how to do the work themselves.
